Page 3:1 - DIED - In this Village April 21st Mrs. Mary WANDS, youngest daughter of Jonas YEARSLEY of Watervliet in the 25th year of her age.

Page 2:4 - THE MURDER OF ROSE WILLIAMS BY HER HUSBAND - Coroner WILHELM on Saturday held an inquest on the body of Mrs. Rose WILLIAMS, a native of Ireland, 35 years of age, whose death was supposed to have been caused by arsnic. The jury rendered the following verdict. That the deceased Rose WILLIAMS came to her death by arsnic administered to her by her husband Andrew WILLIAMS. On the rendition of the verdict, the Coroner committed the prisoner to the Tombs for trial.

MAY 24, 1854

Page 2:1 - The trial of Mrs. ROBINSON indicted for the murder of Timothy LANAGEN and Catherine LUBE by poisoning commenced on Monday afternoon in Troy at an adjourned session of the Court of Oyer & Terminer.....(article goes on about the details).

Page 2:1 - The jury on the trail of Andrew WILLIAMS for the murder of his wife took place in New York last week on Friday brought in a verdict of guilty with a recommendation to mercy. The Judge said that he would remit the recommendation to the Gov.

- Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on Saturday evening on the body of Thos. DEVINE, a laborer from Albany who was found in the Erie Canal, below Schuyler's Bridge. A verdict of accidental drowning was rendered. DEVINE leaves a wife and family.

Coroner W. also held an inquest on the body of John GOODWIN on Sunday found in the State Basin, in this Village, Verdict - Accidental drowning.
