

JANUARY 10, 1855

Page 2:2 - SAD ACCIDENT - We learn from the Troy Times that a lad named Franklin HICKS was dangerously injured while skating upon the ice on the River Saturday afternoon. His skates became entangled in those of another lad. They were both thrown violently. HICKS struck upon his head & received a compound fracture of the skull. He was conveyed to Sheldon's Drug Store in that City, where his injuries received medical attention. We since learn that he died from the effects of his injuries yesterday morning.

Joseph PARKER for many years First Assisant Engineer of the Albany Fire Department, died in that City on Thursday last.

JANUARY 24, 1855

Page 2:4 - A lady very much respected named Mrs. Adelia K. WARNER, age 40 years, who resides in Greenbush committed suicide on Sunday evening at that place. She was missed about 7 o'clock and no trace of her was found until 11, when she was found in the cistern. The cause is unknown as yet for this rash act.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - At the residence of Mr. G. VAN'OLINDA in this Village on 17th inst., by the Rev. Jacob A. LANSING, Mr. Abram E. LANSING & Miss Susan Jane VAN OLINDA, both of Watervliet.

DIED - At the Empire Hotel in this Village January 20th Mrs. Phylance KANDY, age 79 years, formerly of Norwich, Conn.

JANUARY 31, 1855

Page 2:4 - A conductor on a freight train of the Central Railroad named C.A. CURTIS was instantly killed on Saturday morning, by striking his head against a beam on a bridge a short distance north of Cohoes. He was on top of the car at the time of the accident and stood with his back turned toward the bridge, and striking it broke his neck.

FEBRUARY 7, 1855

Page 2:3 - DROWNED - A young man named Frank BUSSEY, a resident of Green Island, was skating on the River, above the State Dam, on Tuesday 30th ult, skated backwards into a hole which had been made by persons cutting ice, and was drowned. His body was recovered, and an inquest held by Coroner WITBECK when a verdict was rendered of accidental drowning.

- SUDDEN DEATH - Mrs. TAYLOR, wife of David TAYLOR, residing in Troy, was found dead in her bed, Friday evening last, upon the return of her husband from this Village, where he had been at work during the day; she having died suddenly and without attendance from any person, an inquest was held by Coroner BONTECOU, of that City, and a verdict was rendered of "death by appoplexy".
