Page 3:1 - We learn from the Troy Times, that Miss Martha ROCKWOOD, a sister of Mr. Geo. C. ROCKWOOD of the Alhambra Saloon, died in Lansingburgh Sunday night from the effects of poison contained in some maple sugar of which she had partaken. It is supposed that the poison was imparted to the sugar by boiling it in a brass kettle. All the other members of the family who had partaken of the sugar were more or less affected by it. The poison was thrown from her stomach, but it engendered an inflammation of which the victim doubtless died.
