Franklin KIRKLAN, the Fireman was badly injured, and lived but a few hours.

OCTOBER 3, 1855

Page 2:3 - An inquest was held by Coroner WITBECK on Friday last, upon the body of Robert POLLOCK, who was accidentally drowned in the Erie Canal, near Lock No. 6, with the team he was driving which was attached by a tow line to the canal boat T. BARTLETT, and then and there drowned. Verdict - accidental drowning.

Page 2:6 - Miss Clara HASKINS was found dead in her bridal chamber near Natchez, Miss. on the 2d inst. After being dressed by her bridesmaids, she requested them to retire for a short time, and when they returned they found her lying lifeless upon her couch with an empty vial which had contained prusic acid still clasped in her hand. She had adopted the desperate alternative of self-destruction rather than marry a man she could not love in obedience to parental authority.

- DIED - In Watervliet on Saturday night, Mrs. Catharine SCHUYLER, in the 92d year of her age.

OCTOBER 17, 1855

Page 3:1- MARRIED - On Monday evening last by Rev. Mr. HOUGHTALING, Mr. George W. COLE to Miss Molly A. PARKER, both of West Troy.

OCTOBER 24, 1855

Page 2:2 - Elisha BARTLETT, age 100 years, 9 months and 13 days died at Georgia, Vermont on the 30th of September. Mr. BARTLETT was born at Chatham, Conn. Dec. 16, 1754. He was a son of a clergyman and the eldest of ten children. He served 13 months in the Continental Army, under his brother Capt. Samuel BARTLETT, marched with his company for Boston and arrived just after the Battle of Bunker Hill - was in the division that fortified Dorchester Heights - was present at the evacuation of Boston - was in the Battle of Brooklyn Heights - of White Plains, and of the capture of BURGOYNE. A few days previous to his death he affirmed and it is believed, that he had walked unaided every day for 100 years.
