Page 2:2 - The following were intended for last weeks publication but unavoidably arrived at the printing office just after our paper was worked off which of course was just too late. However, as we feel in duty bound to record all passing events in our own vicinity, we give them publicity in the present no: Distressing casualty - On the 4th Inst James, a son of Mr. William MULIN, of this Village, aged about three years was missed by his parents - a search was instantly made and although he was missing but a few moments he was found drown in the celler; and this little favorite who went out full of life and glee was returned to his parents a stiffened corpse which no exertion of friends could restore to life. A coroner's jury was summoned which returned a verdict of accidental drowning. It appears that he went out on to the outside celler door which was old and laid loosely over the doorway, and fell into the water which is about two feet deep in the celler.

The house of Mr. MULINS stands on the west side of the canal two doors north of the Schenectada Turnpike. It is understood that several cellers in that vicinity have been flooded since the enlargement of the canal, either because the canal banks are not finished or are not properly puddled; and we sincerely hope something will be done to remedy the evil before the water is raised 18" for if there is not, many of the cellers will be rendered useless.

Page 2:5 - Death of a member of Congress - We are pained to learn that the Hon. Anson BROWN, a representative in Congress from the District composed of the Counties of Saratoga and Schenectada died last evening at his residence Ballston Spa. Mr. BROWN returned from Washington about a week ago quite ill and much enfeebled but it was hoped that a change of air would restore him but he has fallen in mid career of a life of honor and usefulness. He had lived without reproach, died to be universally lamented. (Journal June 15)
