The accident was not observed by anyone on this side of the River, but a man named MURPHY on the Troy side seen him fall, and immediately put out in a yawl boat, but arrived too late to render any assistance as he sank for the last time when within about 50 feet of him. The body was recovered on Sunday morning and a Coroner's inquest held. The deceased was a laboring man, about 40 years of age, and leaves a family.

Page - A WOMAN BURNED TO DEATH - The Albany Knickerbocker learns that a most deplorable accident occurred a few miles east of Bloomingdale, Rensselaer Co. on Thursday night. An old widow lady by the name of Mrs. DENMORE, living very secluded and alone, retired to her bed early that evening. Almost 11 o'clock, smoke was seen issuing from the premises; and the door was burst open and her bedding discovered in flames. As soon as possible the fire was extinguished and Mrs. D. carried into another room dreadfully burned all over the body. She lingered until about 4 o'clock Friday morning, when death put an end to her suffering. It is supposed that the bedding caught fire from a lamp left burning.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - On Wednesday morning June 18, at the residence of O.L. WHELOCK, Phelps Mills, NY, by Rev. P.C. WHELOCK, Samuel C. PEAK & Anna WHELOCK, both of West Troy.

Page 2:2 - DROWNED - A young lady of 17 years of age named Anna ARMSTRONG residing with her parents on Green Island was drowned in the State Basin the lower branch of the Mohawk River (on Friday Night last). It appears that she had had some difficulty at home, and left the house that afternoon. She was last seen alive towards the evening of that day walking near the banks of the Basin. Her body was found on Saturday, and Coroner WANDS held an inquest and a jury returned a verdict of accidental drowning.

Page 2:1 - A woman named MCCANN residing just below Albany, was brutally murdered by her husband Francis MCCANN some time during Monday night. He had escaped and up to yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock had not been captured.

- A little boy about five years of age, a son of Patrick MULLOWENY of Cohoes was drowned in the Erie Canal at Lock No. 15 on the 30th ult.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - On the 8th inst. by Rev. Dr. GREGORY, Mr. George R. MENEELY & Miss Achsah B. DICKINSON, all of this Village.
