Page 2:3 - Coroner Joseph BORN, of Albany, died Friday afternoon. He had been unwell for nearly two years - Coroner B. was a native of Albany, and had always enjoyed the respect of his fellow citizens.

Page 2:3 - DEATH OF MR. WISWALL - Ebenezer WISWALL, long a resident of this vicinity, and proprietor of the ferries between this Village & Troy, died quite suddenly on Friday afternoon last. The circumstances of his death were somewhat singular. He was in the Village, about as usual, on Thursday, although suffering considerably from the extreme heat. After returning home that evening, he complained of feeling a little unwell and also on the morning offriday, but no serious apprehensions were entertained. Upon arising from bed in the afternoon, where he had lain for a short time, one of the family in the room, noticing the unusual pallor which overspread his features, said to him, "You look extremely pale as though you were about to faint." and to which he replied, "I don't know but I shall." These were the last words he spoke, and in a short time after breathed his last. His funeral was attended by a large concourse of citizens, at his late residence about a mile northwest of the Village on Sunday afternoon last.

Page 3:1 - DIED - In Watervliet on the 18th last, Ebenezer WISWALL, in the 80th year of his age.

Page 2:1 - George WILSON, a negro tried and convicted of the murder of Capt. PALMER, of the schooner "Eudora Imogene" at the recent term of the Westchester Co. Court of Oyer and Terminer, was executed on Friday last in the yard of the County Prison at White Plains. He died protesting his innocence.

Page 2:5 - DIED - In Havana, Cuba, on the 16th inst., of yellow fever, James FOX of this Village.

## AUGUST 6, 1856

Page 2:4 - Gen. Henry STANTON, Asst. Quartermaster Gen., U.S. Army died at Fort Hamilton on Saturday.

- A young man named David I. WARNER, was thrown out of a wagon in Schoharie Village, and so badly injured that he soon died.
- Sam GARRETT was hanged at Sacramento, Calif., on the 27th of June for the murder of the father of Louisa BRICKELL, to whom he was married five days before his execution. She has clung to him since the murder and before too.
