it is supposed that he walked into the Canal and was drowned. The deceased was about 45 years of age and had been employed as a maltster in Dunlap's Brewery and resided in the lower part of this Village. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest at which the facts above stated were elicited.

Page 2:5 - KILLED ON THE RAILROAD - A man named SHAW of Waterford was instantly killed Monday by the 1 P.M. train on the Northern Railroad. He walking along side the track at the curve above Cohoes and on the Engineers starting the whistle, to alarm him, he became confused and stepped directly on the track, was caught, runover and literally cut into pieces.

- DIED - In this Village Friday the 15th inst., Mary Ann, youngest daughter of the late J.B. HOUTHTALING, in the 21st year of her age.

- In Watervliet on Monday the 18th inst. Cornelius MARSHALL, age 83 years 11 months & 17 days. Friends and acquaintances are invited to attend his funeral from his late residence on the Cohoes Road, just north of this Village, at 1 o'clock P.M. today.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - At St. Joseph's Church in Troy on Sunday May 24th 1857, by Rev. Mr. TALBOT, Michael DROLLET & Alphonsine DINEAC, both of this Village.

DIED - In this Village on Friday May 22d of typhoid fever, Inez Isadore, only daughter of Abram & Frances H. MYERS, aged 8 years 1 month & 2days (POEM)

JUNE 3, 1857

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Troy on Friday July 4th Friday 1856, by Rev. Dr. C.G. BALDWIN, William A. SWARTOUT & Miss Jane E. NOXON, both of this Village.

JUNE 10, 1857

Page 2:6 - DIED - At the residence of Charles G. HILL, in this Village on Sunday evening 7th inst. in the 28th year of her age, Mary Jane, daughter of Nathan B. & Abigail GLEASON. Her remains will be taken to Salem, Washington Co. for interment.

JUNE 17, 1857

Page 2:3 - On Saturday morning an old man named ANDERSON while attempting to cross the tract at Chatham Centre Station was instantly killed by the Express Train from Albany. The Engineer did all in his power to prevent the accident. The body of ANDERSON was thrown a distance of 40 feet and was terribly mutilated.
