Page 2:5 - DEATH OF JOHN C. STEVENS - John C. STEVENS died in Hoboken on Wednesday last. His death was caused by enlargement of the heart and disease of the kidneys. He had been sick for several weeks. The flags at the Hoboken Ferry and the different yachts were at half mast Thursday afternoon as a mark of respect. Commodore STEVENS is chiefly known and celebrated for his connection with American yachting.

Page 2:3 - FOUND DROWNED - The body of Philip POWERS, Lock Tender of Lock No. 15, Erie Canal, Cohoes was found yesterday morning in the Canal on the level between Lock 14 & 15. He was last seen alive about 5 o'clock, Monday afternoon. It is presumed that he accidentally fell. Coroner WITBECK held the inquest and the jury returned a verdict - Death above.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Whitehall on the 18th inst. by the Rev. Mr. TAYLOR, Mr. Charles ANGUS of this Village and Miss Sarah A. FRENCH of Troy.

Page 2:2 - CORONER'S INQUEST - Cor. WITBECK held an inquest on Wed. morning last upon the body of John HACK, driver for the Canal boat DURFEE who fell from the boat about 1 o'clock that morning, when between Locks7& 8 Erie Canal. The deceased was about 18 years of age and a resident of Buffalo. A verdict of accidental drowning was rendered.

- A lad about 14 years of age, son of Jas. STRAHAN, Troy while walking on the dock just above the Ferry slip on that side on Monday morning last accidentally fell in the River and was drowned.
