Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In West Troy December 26th by Rev. A. CANOLL, Mr. Wm. J. HOUGHTON of New Scotland and Miss Phebe Elizabeth CAMPBELL of Knox.

DIED - At Watervliet Plank Road Tollgate on Tuesday January 5th 1858, Charles Augustus, son of William & Mary Ann OWEN, age 3 years & 5 months. Friends and acquaintances of the family are respectfully invited to attend the funeral at the above place at Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - On the 8th inst by the Rev. John L. NEWMAN of Albany, Mr. W.H. DYER to Miss Eurenia WOODWOORTH all of West Troy. (prob. misprint for WOODWORTH)

DIED - In this Village on Sunday January 10th 1858, Martha A. youngest daughter of John & Martha PERRIGO, age 2 years 6 months & 18 days.

FEBRUARY 3, 1858

Page 3:1 - DIED - In this Village on the 1st inst. William James, youngest son of Edward & Elizabeth LAWRENCE, age 22 years 7 months & 14 days. Funeral on Thursday at half past two P.M. from his father's residence a few doors south of VIELE's Foundry. The friends of the family are respectfully invited to attend.

FEBRUARY 17, 1858

Page 2:1 - A telegram from Baltimore announces the death of Rev. Beverly WAUGH DD, Senior Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church. The Bishop's age was about 70. He entered the Methodist Ministry in the Year 1809 and has been in active service for a period of 46 years.

Page 2:2 - TRIAL OF MORRISON - The trial of Robert MORRISON on charge of manslaughter, commenced in the County Sessions at Albany, on Friday last and was concluded Monday evening. Mr. M. was indicted for this offence because a couple of bears kept in front of his premises in this Village, one night last fall, fell upon and mangled a man named John HOEY, so badly that he died in a short time. At the trial District Attorney Courtney appeared on behalf of the people while the accused was defended by James H. BRISBIN, Esq. of this Village. The testimony elicited, although more extended, contained we believe, no important facts not established at the Coroner's inquest on the body of HOEY.....(article goes on about the proceedings of the case).....It is understood that they stood 10 in favor of a verdict of acquittal to 2 for conviction.
