Page 2:3 - MURDER - Two men, one named Martin WALLACE, and an Irish companion, both laborers, left Buskirk's Bridge Tuesday evening to go to Eagle Bridge. They had been drinking pretty freely. During the evening WALLACE's companion was found dead on the highway. He had undoubtedly been beaten to death with a club. Officers were immediately sent after WALLACE, supposed murderer, and at a late hour he was arrested at Wait's Corners, some two miles north of Eagle Bridge. He was traveling towards Canada. The gloves of the murdered man and \$15.00 in money were found in possession of the prisioner. The name of the murdered man is Barney McINTYRE.

Page 2:6 - DIED - In New York on Monday Feb. 22d 1858, Clarkson Floyd CROSBY of Watervliet in the 41st year of his age.

Page 2:2 - The Hon. C.F. CROSBY's funeral was attended yesterday morning by a large concourse of relatives and friends at the Reformed Dutch Church in Market Street, of which previous of his removal from this City, he was an active member. The religious exercises were conducted by Chancellor FERRIS & Rev. T.L. CUYLER and the remains were then taken to Greenwood. Mr. CROSBY died at the residence of Mr. James BROWN and his body was removed to the mansion of his father in Rutger's Place from which the funeral procession started yesterday. Among those present at the Church were Ex-Gov. CLARK, Senator KELLEY and others who had been associated with Mr. CROSBY in public life.
