Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In this Village Jan 1, 1859 by Rev. J.N. FAIRCHILD, Mr. Josephus AGNUS & Helen M. BARTLETT, all of West Troy.

- In Troy on the 1st inst. by Rev. C.P. SHELDON, Mr. James COLLINS of this Village & Miss Jennie SCRIVENS of the former place.

JANUARY 12, 1859

Page 2:2 - DEAD - James McCROSSEN, Asst. Engineer of the Albany Fire Department died last week. His funeral was attended by the Department on Thursday afternoon.

Page 2:5 - DEATH OF AN OLD MAN - John ZERNISNEY, a Polander by birth, died in this Village on Saturday morning last. He was probably one of the oldest man living in the vicinity being 82 years of age. Mr. Z. had been employed at the Arsenal for the last 21 years.

Page 2:5 - FATAL ACCIDENT ONFRIDAY LAST - A man named Barney KENNEDY, fell down from a ladder while employed at ROY & Co's Factory in the lower part of the Village, and was so seriously injured that he died on Sunday morning.

Page 3:1 - DIED - In Troy Friday 7th inst. Minerva B., wife of Elijah HURLBUT, age 25 years 6 months 11 days.

- In this Village on Sunday 9th inst. Patrick ROONEY in the 36th year of his age.

JANUARY 19, 1859

Page 2:3 - DROWNED - Henry CLINTON & John WARD two employees at the Gas Works Troy, were missed from home on Sunday evening the 9th inst. On Saturday morning one of the ferry men discovered a cap frozen in the ice, which subsequently was identified as belonging to one of the men. There is, ^{therefore} little doubt that the missing men in attempting to cross the ice were drowned.

Page 2:4 -CORRECTION - In our item last week headed FATAL ACCIDENT, we unintentionally killed the wrong man. It was John and not Barney KENNEDY that fell from the ladder.

- DEAD - Capt. Levi SMITH for several years Commander of the steamer Francis SKIDDY died in New York on Thursday last. His remains were brought to Troy for interment.

- Capt. Tunis VAN VECHTEN jr of Continental Company B, 76th Regiment, died in Albany on Friday. The funeral was attended by several military companies on Sunday.
