Page 2:1 - UNITED IN DEATH - A few days since, was seen in Portsmouth, Ohio the solemn spectacle of a funeral in which were two hearses in succession, bearing to their last resting place the remains of a husband and wife, who, after a pilgrimage together of 45 years, had together, on the same morning, gone upon the long journey from which no traveler has yet returned. Page 2:2 - DROWNED - A man named John O'NEIL was drowned at the upper ferry in this Village, by breaking through the ice on Sunday evening. His body was not recovered until the next morning. CoronerWITBECK held an inquest. The deceased was a married man and leaves a family to mourn his loss. The deceased was in company with a man named David HAYES, who also broke through the ice but was fortunately rescued.

- PROBABLY MURDER - The dead body of a Miss CARROLL was found in a creek at Greenbush, on Friday night under such circumstances as to give rise to a suspicion of foul play. A coroner now has the matter in charge.
