Page 2:3 - Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on the 14th inst upon the body of a little son of Mr. ADAMS, an employee in the Harmony Mills Cohoes who was accidentally drowned in the Cohoes Company's Canal.

SUDDEN DEATH - Patrick CONNEL, age 14 years and engaged as a driver on the Canal, died quite suddenly Monday afternoon. Coroner WITBECK was summoned yesterday morning, & held an inquest. The jury returned a verdict of death from congestion of the lungs.

Page 2:3 - DEAD - Wm. ENSON, Leader of the Mechanics Coronet Band, died at So. Troy yesterday morning.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Hudson on the 29th ult by the Rev. Dr. GREGORY, Oscar G. DITMARS Esq. of New York and Sarah Jane COOK of the former place.

DIED - of consumption on the 24th inst. in the Town of Rye, New York, Lois M., only daughter of Alfred & Mercy RICHARDSON, age 20 yrs 1 mo. & 6 dys. (POEM)

JULY 13, 1859

Page 3:2 - Edward LYONS a young man about 21 years of age and son of Dr. LYONS of Watervliet, died quite suddenly on Sunday afternoon last. A post-mortem examination revealed the fact that he died of a disease of the heart.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In this Village on the 4th inst by Rev. G.L. ROOF, Mr. Samuel GRAHAM & Miss Martha ANDERSON both of this place.
