Page 2:5 - Elisha SCOFIELD, a Revolutionary Soldier, died at Jefferson County NY, a few days since, 95 years old. He was a native of Bedford, Westchester Co., where he resided until 1781, and for the five previous years was amid many of the most exciting scenes of the Revolution.

Page 2:4 - DROWNED - Edward LOBDELL,<sup>a</sup> Canal boatman, belonging at Painted Post fell into Lock 4 Erie Canal on Friday night and was drowned. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on Saturday, the jury returning a verdict of accidental drowning.

OCTOBER 26, 1859

Page 2:3 - INQUEST - Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on Sunday morning last, upon the body of Catharine WHITTEN, a woman residing near the upper side-cut, who came to her death sometime during the previous night. The jury returned a verdict of death by suffocation.

Page 2:6 - DIED - At Albany Saturday afternoon, MISS Melissa, age 8 yers & 7 months and on Sunday evening, Minerva, age 7 years, 1 month & 8 days, daughters of Rev. E. STOVER.
