Page 2:3 - DROWNED - John MAGUIRE accidentally drowned on Lock 16 Erie Canal on Saturday night. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on his body Sunday

Page 2:5 - A remarkable romance in real life has lately occurred in Louisa County, Iowa. A man named CRALL has been reunited to his wife and family after a separation of 47 years. He was a soldigrin the War of 1812, and his family then resided near Philadelphia. His wife heard that he was killed, and afterwards went west with some friends. After his discharge he returned and was told his wife and children had moved away and afterwards died. He has since been living in Jefferson County New York and only came to a knowledge of his wife's existence by her attempt to secure a land warrant on his account.

Page 2:1 - Washington IRVING died suddenly Monday night at his residence at Irvington. He resided to his sleeping room at half past 10 o'clock, and after undressing, fell and expired in about five minutes. He was in the 77th year of his age.

Page 2:3 - CAGED - John BURDICK jr the man who last Spring was detained by the Coroner on suspicion of being engaged in the murder of Robert MORRISON, this Village was arrested in New York last week, having in his possession a number of pictures stolen from Schoonmaker's Ambrotype Gallery, Troy. He was taken to Troy and placed in jail.

Page 2:4 - Two married women met in the Streets of Baltimore Tuesday, and at once pitched into each other.

Fearful destruction of bonnets and crinolines ensued, and finally one of the tigresses being knocked down, the other seized a flour barrel and broke it upon her. Jealousy incited the combat.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Troy on Thursday 24th inst by Rev. E. GOSS, Mr. George C. ADAMS of Greenfield, Mass. & Miss Mary PARMENTER of the former place.

DIED - In this Village on Monday Nov 28th 1859, Wallace B., only child of Charles & Sarah Jane HAYFORD, age 6 months & 11 days.
