JUNE 6, 1860

Page 2:4 - APPOINTED - Lorenzo E. ABBOTT has been appointed agent at the Northern Railroad Station in this Village. He entered upon the discharge of his duties on the 1st inst. ABBOTT is obliging and accommodating, and travelers will be sure to find him "The right man in the right place."

TWO BOYS DROWNED AT ALBANY - About noon Sunday, a small boat containing five boys was upset by coming in contact with a hawser of the steamer BALTIC and two brothers named Andrew & Peter SMITH were drowned. The others were rescued with difficulty.

Page 2:2 - John L. SCHOOLCRAFT one of the most respected citizens of Albany - President of the Commercial Bank of that City, and for two terms member of Congress from this District - died at St. Catherine's C.W. Thursday night. His remains were conveyed to Albany the succeeding day and the funeral took place from Dr. Campbell's Church on Saturday afternoon.
