Page 2:4 - KILLED ON THE GREAT EASTERN - About 10 o'clock on Friday night, Thomas LEAVIT fell down the wheelhouse of the Great Eastern, and fractured his skull. - The unfortunate man died soon after. About an hour later, a deck hand on board the Mammoth steamer fell overboard and was drowned.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Trinity Church on Saturday last, 30th ult by Rev. George W. HATHAWAY, Rector, Mr. George BILLINGHAM & Miss Ellen GLANCEY, both of this Village.

- June 28th by Rev. A. LUDDEN, Mr. Wilber McDONALD of this Village and Miss Elizabeth SANDS of Knoxville.

DIED - In this Village on the 29th ult Daniel CARTHY, aged 72 years.

Page 2:3 - DROWNED - A young man by the name of Rufus WILSON, about 18 years of age, engaged on Lock 17 as an assistant, fell into the Lock on the evening of the 4th and was drowned. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on the morning following, and the jury rendered a verdict in accordance with the foregoing facts.

- On Saturday afternoon last, a little child about two years old named Mary LISTEN was drowned by accidentally falling in the cistern at the residence of her father on Ohio Street.

Page 2:6 - DIED - In Weston's Mills, Cattaraugus County, New York July 3rd, Mary Bland, eldest daughter of Horace P. & Mary A. WEST, age 8 years 3 months & 16 days.

Page 2:3 - DROWNED - A lad of about 7 years of age named Leopold BUSHMAND, fell into the Canal near the Ogden Mills in Cohoes on Thursday last, and was drowned. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest upon his body.
