Page 2:4 - DROWNED - The Cohoes Cataract says that a man named MALLOY, was found dead in the Canal at Lock 13 on Wednesday afternoon. He was last seen alive on Friday evening of the previous week when he purchased a suit of clothes at one of the stores in the Village and started out, with a bottle in his hand. The body was discovered by the Lock Tender, who noticed an unpleasant smell in the neighborhood of the Lock, and on searching he found the poor fellow in the culvert. He was a laborer in Cohoes and leaves a family. Coroner WITBECK held the inquest.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - On Tuesday evening 14th inst by Rev. Joseph T. DURYEA, of Troy, James A. CLARK of Louisville, Kentucky to Fannie A., daughter of John MORRIS Esq. of this Village.

Page 2:6 - DIED - Suddenly on Saturday afternoon 18th inst. of disease of the heart, Samuel SAGUE in the 52d year of his age. Funeral will take place from his late residence corner of Mansion & Groton Streets in this Village, this (Wed) afternoon at 3 o'clock. Friends are respectfully invited to attend.

Page 2:5 - CORONER'S INQUEST - Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on Wednesday last, upon the body of a man named Roger M. SHERMAN, who fell from a wagon two days previous, receiving injuries from the effect of which he died.

- On Saturday Coroner W. also held an inquest on the body of John HAYES, a small child who fell into the Canal near the Genesee St. Bridge and was drowned. - Verdict: Accidental drowning.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - On the 16th inst. by Rev. Dr. GREGORY, Mr. Walter BONCE & Miss Adaline ALSTON, both of this Village.

Page 2:3 - FATAL ACCIDENT ON THE CENTRAL RAILROAD - The early train from the west, Sunday, ran over Mr. John MCGOUN who was asleep on the track at Stanford's Bridge, two miles from West Albany, in this Town, literally cutting him in pieces & mutilating him so horribly as to render recognition impossible. The deceased resided at 52 Fayette St. Albany.

Page 2:5 - DIED - In this Village August 19, 1860 Electa Ann Ostrander, daughter of Stephen & Mary DAY, age 22 years 3 mos. & 6 days. (POEM)
