Page 2:5 - CORONER'S INQUEST - Coroner WITBECK held an inquest Thursday last on the body of a woman named Ellen RYAN who was found dead in her bed at her house (in California Row). The jury rendered a verdict of death from congestion of the lungs (caused by excessive use of liquor).

SUDDEN DEATH - Dr. L.R. CARRIER died quite suddenly, of congestion of the lungs, at his residence in Green Island, on Monday afternoon.

Page 2:3 - FUNERAL - The Jackson Guards, Conqueror Engine Co. #3, Rip Van Winkle Co. #1, Protection Co. #2, & Oswald Hose Co., accompanied by Sullivan's Troy Band, attended the funeral of John HUTTON Saturday last. The deceased was a member of the two first named companies, and at one time held the position of Assistant Engineer of the Village Fire Department.
