The trestle work struck the bridge, and slid from the car, carrying with it five of the laborers, two of whom fell in the Canal, and the others upon the tow-path. Below we give a list and the extent of their injuries as far as we could ascertain:

Michael LARKINS age 45 years - severe fracture of the skull - died in a few hours.

Michael CANNOLL, concussion of the brain - probably will result fatally

James DONOVAN, fracture of the right leg and internal injuries - probably fatal.

James MAGRATH, resides in Troy - extent of injuries unknown.

Another laborer badly bruised and scratched could not ascertain his name.

We believe all these parties, with the exception of MAGRATH, reside in the upper portion of this Village, and in the vicinity of the junction.

Page 2:4 - DROWNED - A son of Nathan FIDDLER about 10 years of age, was drowned on Wednesday evening, while bathing in the Canal a short distance north of the Arsenal. The body however, was not recovered until Friday evening. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest.

The body of Thomas RYAN of Cohoes, was found in the Canal just north of the Village on Friday last. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest, the jury returning a verdict of accidental drowning.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - On 10th inst by Rev. C. OSBORN, Mr. Charles E. LACY & Miss Rachel HAM, all of this Village.

DIED - In this Village on Monday 10th inst., of consumption, Peter DUFFY, age 24 years. Friends and acquaintances are invited to attend the funeral from the family residence on Broad St. near Auburn this (Wed.) afternoon at half past 2 o'clock.

Page 2:5 - DIED - On Sunday morning June 16th at his residence in Watervliet VOLKERT D. OOTHOUT in the 89th year of his age. - On Friday June 14th at the residence of her brother Watervliet Arsenal, Ellen J. STRONG, age 25 years. - In this Village April 24th of paralysis of the heart John HALL, age 61 years.
