The jury returned a verdict that the deceased came to his death from a wound inflicted in his bowels by a knife in the hands of Walter BARRET etc. Yesterday morning BARRET was arraigned before the Coroner when he plead not guilty, to the charge of murder preferred against him and was committed to jail to await the action of the Grand Jury.

JULY 17, 1861

Page 2:4 - SUDDEN DEATH - Luke DOUGAL, age 50 years, died quite suddenly at his residence in the upper part of this Village, on Saturday morning, caused by a violent hemorrhage of the lungs.

- DEATH FROM SUN STROKE - On Wednesday, a blacksmith at the Watervliet Arsenal, named Garret DILLON, while at work in the open air, was prostrated from the effects of the heat. He fell with some violence to the ground, striking the back of his head receiving very severe injuries. From their effects and the results of the sun stroke, he died on Friday. He resided on Saratoga Street and leaves a family of seven children.

Page 2:5 - CORONER'S INQUEST - Coroner WITBECK was called on Thursday evening last to hold an inquest on the body of Albert GROSSKOFF, steersmen on the Canal boat D.W. WHITNEY, who was drowned in Lock 13 Erie Canal, near Cohoes, that afternoon. The boat had entered the Lock, and the deceased stood on the tow-path holding a line, attached to it. In attempting to jump upon the boat, he fell into the water, and was drowned before assistance could be extended to him. After some delay the water was drawn out of the lock and the body was recovered. These facts being adduced on the inquest, the jury returned a verdict of accidental drowning.

JULY 24, 1861

Page 2:3 - CORONER'S INQUEST - Coroner WITBECK held an inquest on Friday last, upon the body of Rosanna McCORMICK, wife of a saloon keeper in the lower part of the Village of Cohoes. She died quite suddenly. A post-mortem examination revealed the fact that she died of congestion of the lungs, superinduced by intemperance, and the Coroner's jury rendered a verdict to that effect.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Schenectady July 7th by Rev. H.L. STARKS, A. Gardner WASHBURN of the Amsterdam Dispatch to Miss Belle EVANS of Schenectady.
