Page 2:4 - A GOLDEN WEDDING - The 50th anniversary of the marriage of Col. Chauncey PRATT & lady of Colvert, Tompkins County, New York, parents-in-law of Rev. Dr. GREGORY, Pastor of the North R.D. Church in this Village, was celebrated with appropriate ceremonies at the residence in that Village, on Tuesday the 3d inst. The scene is represented as having been deeply interesting, as the aged couple stood surrounded by their children and their children's children. The speakers on the occasion were Rev. Mr. BASSLER of Farmersville, Rev. Mr. KELLOGG of Colvert who sustains the relation of pastor to the aged couple and Rev. Dr. GREGORY. Of the last speaker the Trumansburgh News says, "He was evidently disposed to take a very cheerful view of things in general, and of the PRATT Family in particular. He had good reason for it, we are sure that no one found any fault with him. He added much to the pleasures by his genial wit and humor."
