Page 2:3 - DROWNED - Patrick DALY, a man about 28 years of age, a resident of Albany, accidentally walked into the Erie Canal near the upper side-cut at a late hour on Monday evening. His body was not recovered until yesterday morning when Coroner WITBECK summoned a jury and held an inquest. A verdict in accordance with the above facts was stated.

- ACCIDENT IN THE RIVER - The Steamer FRANCES SKIDDY met with an accident on Thursday night last opposite Poughkeepsie, by a collision with a schooner which struck her in the right side about mid ship, and tore open one of her boilers. By the escaped steam several persons were injured as follows: Robert HARDY, Cook died in short time; Isaac BLOOMER, fireman, since dead; William SULLIVAN and Uriah BARRETT, fireman badly scalded and will probably die; E. SIPPERLY, deckhand, cannot recover; Cornelius CONNEL, scalded about the head; James A. YOUNG:of Rochester, Charles STEWART of Ticonderoga & William HUDSON, passengers, scalded and the first injured internally from inhaling steam.

Page 2:2 - Hon. John VANDERZEE, member of Assembly, elect from the First District of this County, died at his residence in the Town of Coeymans, Tuesday morning of typhoid fever. The Board of Supervisors on that morning adopted suitable resolutions and adjourned.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Greenbush on December 7th by Rev. M.W. EMPIE, Mr. Thomas GUNSALUS of this Village and Miss Marietta WETHERWAX of the former place.

Page 2:4 - A suit is now pending before Judge WOLFORD, Albany, brought by R.D. WARNER of this Village for a divorce from his wife Martha A. WARNER. The counsel in the case are PORTER & CAGGER for plff & TREMAINE & MORAN for deft.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In the Ref Dutch Church in this Village on 11th inst., by Rev. Dr. GREGORY, Mr. Walter S. DANN, Edwardsville, ILL. & Miss Mary Esther DANN of this Village.

DIED - In this Village on the 15th inst. Lucy Sims, youngest daughter of Robert & Jane A. ROBINSON, age 1 year 11 months & 28 days.
