her night clothes came in contact with the light and she was immediately enveloped in flames, and as she was a cripple, she was unable to put out the fire which was soon beyond her control. Her screams brought Mr. HILDRETH, who resides downstairs in the same building, to her assistance, but before he reached her, she was so badly burned as to be beyond the hope of recovery. Mr. H. went for a physician at once and Dr. WANDS soon arrived but was unable to do anything more than to administer such remedies as were calculated to relieve the intense agony of the poor sufferer for the time being. As we have before stated, she lingered til afternoon when death came to her relief.

Page 2:4 - RAILROAD ACCIDENT - Mr. John GRANT & wife, residents of Schaghticoke, Rensselaer County, were almost instantly killed yesterday morning, at a place known as Holt's crossing on the line of the Troy & Boston Railroad, by the down train coming in contact with the sleigh in which they were seated, while endeavoring to cross the track.
