Page 2:6 - DIED - In this Village on the 18th inst. Caroline Adelia, wife of Addison PHELPS, age 38 years.

JANUARY 29, 1862

Page 2:6 - DIED - In this Village on Monday 27th inst of congestion of the lungs, Ebenezer POWELL, age 53 years.

Page 2:5 - CHILD BURNED TO DEATH - On Saturday night last, a most distressing casualty occurred at Greenbush, which resulted fatally on Sunday. Mrs. GLEN, wife of Coleman GLEN left her residence and went to the well to get some water. She left behind her, her little girl 4 years old. Upon the stove was a kettle full of snow, which the mother was endeavoring to melt, and while the mother was gone, the little girl undertook to get some snow from the boiler and in doing so her dress came in contact with the fire and ignited. Page 2:3 - Wm. ORELUP sr one of the oldest citizens & businessmen of Cohoes, died at his residence in that Village, on Wednesday last, at the advanced age of 69 years

Page 2:5 - Ernest DOHNMAN, an Albany German who was badly burned a few nights since from his bed clothes taking fire, died at Saturday and was buried the next day with military honors.
