Page 2:6 - DIED - In this Village on Sunday morning June 22 1862, David H. COLE, age 32 years & 8 days.

Page 2:4 - DROWNED - On Saturday last a lad about 10 years of age, son of Mrs. HAINES, while playing with another child fell into the water from the dyke in back of Roy & Company's office, before assistance could reach him was drowned. Nearly every expedient has been resorted to, to recover the body, but up till last evening without success. It is thought by many that the body has been carried by the current out into the River. We are requested to state that should the body of a lad be discovered between here and Albany, the persons finding the same or knowing of such finding, will confer a favor by sending word of the same to the office of A. Page 2:5 - DEATH OF GEN. SCOTT'S WIFE - A telegraphic dispatch from West Point, states that General SCOTT has received an intelligence of the death of his wife at Rome on the 10th inst.
