Page 2:4 - DROWNED - A girl about 8 years of age named Mary Jane AGEN, while playing with other children near Lock 13 Cohoes, on Monday afternoon, fell into the lock and was drowned. Her body was shortly recovered. Coroner WITBECK was summoned and held an inquest yesterday morning, the jury rendering a verdict of accidental drowning.

- Thomas ENSWORTH of Allen, Allegany County, fell from a raft in the Canal near the Junction, on Thursday night last. Efforts were made to rescue him, which proved unavailing, and he was drowned. His body was recovered by the lock tender at that point on Saturday when Coroner WITBECK held an inquest.

- FATAL ACCIDENT - John HENRATTY, a teamster in the employ of Roy & Company was killed on Saturday afternoon last near the corner of Broad & Huron Streets in this Village. He was seated on a load of wool, driving, when the bail upon which he was, slid to the ground, carrying him with it, and the wheels of the wagon passed over his chest, breaking several of his ribs and causing a rupture, - killing him almost instantly. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest, when the above facts were elicited and a verdict in accordance rendered. HENRATTY had been in the employ of Roy & Company for several years, was an industrious man and respected by all who knew him.

- FUNERAL OF EX PRESIDENT VAN BUREN - Was attended on Monday, by a large concourse of people. The remains of this distinguished dead were deposited in the cemetery at Kinderhook.

Page 2:5 - DEATH OF ADJUTANT RUSSELL - Adj. John H. RUSSELL of the 18th Regiment died in Philadelphia yesterday morning, Mr. RUSSELL was a son of William RUSSELL Esq. of this City and a young man of much promise. To instinctive patriotism he added all the social attributes which mark the gentleman. He shared in all the battles passed through by the Army of the Potomac - escaping unscathed<sup>in</sup> all until the terrible conflict before Richmond in one of which he was severely wounded in the ankle. Anxious to reach home for medical treatment, his progress was arrested at Philadelphia by the unfavorable nature of his wound which continued to grow worse until death ended his sufferings. His remains will be brought home for interment.

Page 2:6 - DIED - In Manningham, Butler Co., Alabama, on the 19th ult, Col. Ossian GREGORY, brother of Rev. Dr. GREGORY of this Village.
