Page 2:5 - DIED - In this Village at the residence of her son-in-law R.S. LOBDELL, on Tuesday morning, August 26, Mrs. Mary MARSH, relict of Charles MARSH, age 73 years, 1 month.

- In Ann Arbor, Michigan on the 9th inst. Helen F., wife of A.W. AMES, and daughter of Mrs. Catherine ABRAHAMS, late of this Village, age 30 years & 7 months.

Page 2:2 - DROWNED - The body of a lad about 13 years of age, named George LUDDINGTON, who resided in Troy, was found in the Hudson River near Green Island, on Monday morning. Coroner WITBECK held an inquest, the jury rendering a verdict of accidental drowning.

Page 2:3 - KILLED - We regret to notice among the killed of the 2d Regiment, in the late battles, the name of Oliver H. PORTER of this Village, a member of Company B. The deceased soldier was about 22 years of age. He is a son of John H. PORTER, and resided with his father on Temperance Hill prior to his enlistment. He was buried on the field of battle.

Page 2:4 - DEATH OF JUDGE WILLARD - This venerable citizen and upright judge died at his residence, at Saratoga Springs, on Sunday last, in the 72d year of his age. He was among the first judges elected under the Constitution to the Court of Appeals. He represented the Saratoga District in the Senate, and his death leaves a vacancy.

Page 2:5 - Anthony BURNS, the slave who was arrested in Boston in 1854, remanded to bondage and afterwards redeemed, died at St. Catherine's C.W., on the 27th of July. His disease was consumption, acquired by exposure while trying to clear from debt the church of which he was Pastor.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - On August 19th, by Rev. G.L. ROOF, Mr. Wm. J. McDONALD, of this Village & Miss Mary E. PALMER of Albia.

DIED - In this Village August 26th, Alfred W., son of Wm. W. & Lydia J. SILLIMAN, age 3 mos.

DIED - In Albany on <sup>Mon.</sup> 1st inst. Marilla B. PETRIE, wife of Sebastian B. CRAVER, in the 25th year of her age.
