Page 2:2 - Joe BALDING, a colored man, died in the Zanesville Infirmary on the 11th inst., age 121 years. He was a slave in Fairfax County VA in the days of Washington. He was 13 years of age at the time of BRADDOCK's defeat in 1755. During his slave life, in accordance with the arrangements of his several masters, he had seven wives.

Page 2:3 - A boy named Charles McALLISTER got on board a train on the Central Railroad in Albany, Wednesday, and on attempting to jump off, fell underneath the cars. Several wheels passed over him, mashing his neck to a jelly, peeling off his scalp and breaking one of his arms. He lived about an hour.

- FATAL ACCIDENT - Friday morning a laborer named Anthony DONAHOE, residing at 291 Lumber St., Albany, while engaged in the Lumber District, in the employ of Clark, Sumner & Company was instantly killed by the falling of a pile of lumber. It appears that the lumber had been removed from the yard and was awaiting shipment. A portion of the pile fell upon his head cracking his skull.

Page 2:4 - DEATH OF OLIVER H. PORTER - We have been shown a letter received from Quartermaster McARTHUR, and an accompanying note from Assistant Surgeon WHITON of the 2d Regiment N.Y.V. by John H. PORTER, of this Village relative to the death of his son on the Battlefield, as noticed by us last week. The letter states that he was shot in the Battle at Bristow's Station on Wednesday August 27th, - the ball which caused his death entering his head near the mouth and passing out at the back of his head near the posterior base of the brain. He died almost instantly. His body was buried on the field of battle with all the care and attention possible under the circumstances. The letter further states that it would be an impossibility at present to recover the body of the deceased, as the enemy now hold that ground, and a flag of truce would not be allowed for such a purpose. The writers also pay a tribute to the bravery of the deceased.

Page 2:6 - MARRIED - In Albany June 2d 1862, by Rev. Mr. MCKNIGHT, Mr. George H. DYER of this Village & Miss C. Antoinette LAY of the former place.

DIED - In this Village on Tuesday September 2d, Janet, wife of Charles McLELLAN, in the 58th year of her age.
