expired on the 2d inst. after a protracted illness of six years. The deceased was a man of great energy and perseverance and contributed as much to the business and enterprise of West Troy as any other man. As a citizen he will be missed by all. He was naturally quiet and unobtrusive, genial and warm in his attachments, benevolent in his disposition, strictly honest and punctual in his dealings, and amid financial loss and failing health, was always cheerful and full of hope.

Mr. W. was a member of the Ohio Street M.E. Church in this Village, and one of its firmest supporters. As a Christian he was never enthusiastic, but never indifferent. Some may have been more active in the cause of God NONE more strongly attached to it. Some talked more and made higher professions in spiritual things, none ever FELT deeper than he. Failings in common with us all he had, but he was the last man to cover them or apologize for them. He never attempted to rear his hopes of heaven upon a sandy foundation, or measure his proficiency in the divine life by a false standard.

His last hours were characterized by a Christian resignation. There was neither surprise or alarm in the final struggle. Faith had set off and lent her realizing fight and hence the evening of his existence was radiant with the splendors of an immortal life. When about to die, he called his children to him, smiled upon them (for he could not converse) whispered Bless the Lord, and passed away.

The body of the infant could not be found; the oldest child was burned to a cinder, and the corpse of the other was found, with its arms and legs consumed.
