Page 2:4 - Jeremiah ARMSTRONG, one of the Pioneers of Ohio, died in Columbus in that State, recently aged 78 years. His father early settled near the mouth of the big Kanawha. The family were attacked by Wyandotte Indians, his mother and three children being killed. His father escaped. Himself, brother and sister were taken to upper Sandusky, adopted by different tribes and separated. The deceased remained with the Indians for four years, when he regained his liberty. He afterwards settled at Columbus. His brother and sister were also rescued.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Trinity Church in this Village by Rev. G.W. HATHAWAY Rector, Tuesday October 28th, Mr. Benjamin GARVEY of New York & Miss Helen A., daughter of E.H. ST JOHN Esq. of this place.

DIED - In this Village on Sunday October 26th, Daniel C. STEWART in the 43d year of his age.

Page 2:2 - THE COHOES MURDER CASE - A murder occurred in Cohoes on Thursday night. The deceased, Thomas MAGUIRE, who is a pedler of stockings and other goods on the Canal, was left in charge of a boat between Locks 12 & 13. While he was watching the craft, another boat came by, and the hands desired to cast a line over MAGUIRE's boat. He attempted to cut the line, whereupon the hands of the other craft threw a stick of wood at him. He made some angry remarks, which were followed by a pistol shot from the boat, which killed him instantly. Several parties have been arrested on the charge of committing this unprovoked homicide, but the murderer cannot be identified. The jury after hearing the testimony rendered the following verdict, "That the said Thomas MAGUIRE came to his death, on the night of the 30th day of October 1862 by being shot with buck and small shot, discharged from a pistol in the hands of a person on board MICHAEL WERLE of Buffalo - said gun being at the time being in the hands of some person on said boat unknown to the jury."

Page 2:3 - General MITCHELL died at Beaufort on the 30th ult, of yellow fever, which is prevailing.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Grass Valley, Calif. September 7th by Rev. J. DALTON, Mr. Daniel CLANCE & Miss Mary ALLEN, both formerly of this Village.

DIED - In this Village on the 28th ult, Hiram CUTTING, aged 60 years.
