Page 2:3 - DROWNED - A man named CULLIGAN an employee at the Harmony Mills Cohoes fell into one of the Canals in Cohoes on Sunday and was drowned. The body was soon recovered and Coroner BRENNAN held an inquest.

Page 2:6 - DIED - In this Village on the 24th inst., Angelica SCHUYLER, wife of Saunders LANSING jr, aged 67 years. The relatives & friends of the family are invited to attend her funeral on Thursday the 26th inst. at 3 o'clock A.M. at the residence of her husband in Groton Street.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Troy on Monday March 23d by Rev. W.H. SMITH, Mr. John CLARK of this Village & Miss Eliza CLEVELAND of that City.

DIED - At this Village on Saturday March 28th, Alfred RICHARDSON in the 64th year of his age.

APRIL 8, 1863

Page 2:2 - DEAD - We are credibly informed that Julia CONDON, the young woman suspected of child murder is being implicated in throwing her infant in a privy in the upper part of this Village - an account of which we published three weeks since - died at the Troy Hospital on Friday last.

Page 2:3 - FUNERAL - The Conqueror Engine Co. No. 3 with a band of music, attended the funeral of James DOYLE, a former member of the company, who was shot while on picket duty at Harper's Ferry.

Page 2:4 - Yellow Wolf, Chief of the Iowa Tribe of Indians, and the eloquent Indian orator, died at Washington on Sunday evening of pneumonia and was buried Monday in the Congressional Cemetery. His last moments were spent in advising his companions to live in peace with the whites.

Page 2:5 - DIED - In this Village on Saturday April 4th, Kate M. wife of Frank MILLIMAN, age 30 years.
