Page 2:4 - A LONG OBIT ON THE DEATH OF STONEWALL JACKSON - Stonewall JACKSON was killed by his own men on the night of Saturday's fighting at Chancellorville,.....

Page 2:6 - DEATH OF COL. NORTON - Col. Franklin NORTON of the 123d N.Y. who was shot in the abdomen at Chancellorville, died at Washington on Tuesday. His body was embalmed and sent to his home at Union-Village, Washington County, New York.

Page 2:3 - CORONER'S INQUEST - Coroner BRENNAN, of this Village, held an inquest Monday morning, upon the body of Cornelius TOOHEY, who was drowned in the lock at the upper side-cut on Sunday last while endeavoring to remove some obstruction therein. The jury rendered a verdict of accidental drowning.

SUICIDE - On Friday morning last, Lt. W.M. SHEAR, Quarter-Master of the 2d Regiment, committed suicide at the Marshall Infirmary, by cutting his throat.

Page 2:4 - PROBABLE MURDER - Intense excitement was created at Corning, Winslow & Company's Dock, 6th Ward, Monday afternoon. A difficulty occurred between Wm. BROWNHALL, Captain of a Canal boat and a hand named Samuel KELLY. The latter stabbed the Captain with a knife, inflicting a wound which is feared will prove fatal. A crowd of 300 people collected, and KELLY hid from their threatened vengeance. High Constable MCMULKIN finally boarded the boat, took KELLY into custody and lodged him in jail. (The Troy Times).
