Page 2:3 - BRUTAL MURDER - Between 6 & 7 o'clock last Wednesday evening, two men named Patrick FLYNN & John A. COBURN, master & owner of the Canal boat EVER-GREEN became engaged in an altercation near the upper cut, Albany, which led to a fight between them, during which FLYNN picked up a stave and struck COLBURN across the crown of the skull fracturing it and causing his death in about three hours. FLYNN has been arrested and is now in jail.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Troy on the 16th inst by Rev. mr. CUSHING, Mr. Charles WARFORD of this Village and Miss Louise S. GREEN of Cairo.

- In Saratoga Springs on the 6th inst. by Rev. N.B. SPALDING, Mr. Charles ANGUS of this Village to Miss Martha CURTIS of Albany.

Page 2:4 - DEATH OF LT. WILMONT - ~~Richard~~ ^{Lt.} WILMONT of the Griswold Cavalry who was wounded by the accidental shooting of himself at the camp, a short time ago, died last week from the effects of the injury. Lt. W. was a soldier in the true sense of the term. Although a comparatively young man he had seen much service. He had served ten years in the ranks of the British Cavalry, - and during most of that time was stationed in India. He was thoroughly posted in the requirements of that branch of the service, and was highly esteemed for his many excellent qualities of head and heart. He went off with the Black Horse Cavalry as adjutant and was considered one of the most competent officers in the Regiment.

Page 2:6 - DIED - At the residence of his grandparents in this Village, on the 19th inst., Frederick, infant son of ~~Edward~~ D. & Elizabeth M. BUNKER of Hudson, aged 3 months.

SEPTEMBER 2, 1863

Page 2:3 - DROWNED - A lad about 12 years of age, son of William W. DYER, was drowned in the Mill Canal in front of the Flouring Mills in the First Ward on Monday afternoon. It is supposed that he was playing on a raft there and slipped off. His hat was found floating in the Canal, and a search being instigated, his body was soon after recovered.

Page 2:6 - DIED - In this Village August 26th after a short illness, Ann Elizabeth, wife of Arthur S. WATERMAN and eldest daughter of George & Elizabeth YEARSLEY, age 21 years, 10 months & 10 days.
