Page 2:1 - DEATH OF CONGRESSMAN LOVEJOY - The Hon. Owen LOVEJOY, representative in Congress from the Fifth District of Illinois died in Brooklyn on Friday night last. He was born in Kennebec County, ME January 6, 1811 and was consequently 53 years of age. He passed his boyhood working on a farm and paid his way through Bowdoin College by teaching school. Studying theology, he received a call to the Pastorate of the Congregational Church of Princeton, Ill. and officiated there for 16 years until in 1854 he was elected to represent his District in Congress where he was prominent as a bold and fearless advocate of freedom for all. In 1837 his brother Rev. E.P. LOVEJOY an anti-slavery editor, was murdered in Alton, ILL by a pro-slavery mob; and since then Owen LOVEJOY had naturally enough manifested a deeper intensity in his hatred of slave institutions. Mr. LOVEJOY was a ready speaker, a bold debater of political questions, honest as he was fearless, and in private life amiable and irreproachable. He has been complaining since last January, came to Brooklyn, on the 15th inst., and since then was confined to his bed by an infection of the liver and kidneys. He was attended in his last illness by his wife and daughter and many sympathizing friends.
