Page 2:3 - DIED - In this Village on the 12th inst. of consumption, Thomas COLLOPY, age 58 years.

- At his late residence in Watervliet, on Saturday, the 16th inst., after a few weeks illness, Abraham WEATHERWAX, age 54 years 1 month & 20 days.

Page 3:1 - DEAD - John F. KELLY, late Deputy Sheriff, died quite suddenly at an early hour this morning. He was sitting in his chair, and with scarcely a moment's warning, expired in an apoplectic fit. Deceased was about 29 years of age.

Page 2:3 - KILLED IN BATTLE - In the list of the killed in the fierce battle on Red River, we notice the name of Col. Lewis BENEDICT of Albany. Col. B. was the son of the late Lewis BENEDICT. He was about 45 years of age, and was widely known. He entered the Volunteer service in 1861, as Lt. Colonel of the 2nd Fire Zouaves. He was taken prisoner at the Battle of Williamsburgh, and was three months in confinement at Richmond. In 1862 he was appointed to the command of the One hundred and sixty Second New York Volunteers, and left with his Regiment with the Bank's Expedition. For sometime past he had commanded the First Brigade of the First Division, composed of the Duryea Zouaves, Lt. Col. CAIN; the Buffalo Regiment Col. LOVE, and the 13th Maine Col. FESSENDEN
