Page 2:4 - REMARKABLE DEATHS - We see it stated that 4 aged Revolutionary Soldiers died on Saturday the 12th ult in Allegany Township, Westmoreland Co. PA. Their names & ages were: John DELAP, aged 80; John GALLAGHER, aged 104; Robert DODDS, 79; John JOHNSON, 103. Their combined ages amounted to 366 years and their average age is 91.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - At West Troy on the 11th inst., by the Rev. Benjamin I. LANE, Mr. Alfred C. SCOVILL to Miss Mary Eliza FRATT, both of this Village.

Page 2:3 - We regret to announce the death of Robt. SOUTHEY, on Tuesday March 21st at his residence in Keswick. For this event his friends must have been long prepared for the last three years he has been in a state of mental darkness and a twelfth month ago he was not able to recognize those who had been his companions from his youth. (POEM)

Com. PORTER, the U.S. Minister at Constantinople died there on the 3d inst.

Page 3:1 - DIED - In this Village on the 18th inst of consumption, Alonzo C. BALDWIN, son of Ephraim BALDWIN, age 35 years. He left the world in the hope of a blessed resurrection and evinced during his painful and protracted sickness the resignation of a Christian.

Page 3:1 - MARRIED - In this Village on April 25, 1843, by Rev. Z. PHILLIPS, Mr. Chester BACHELDOR & Miss Olive Maria CHAFY, both of West Troy.

DIED - In Watervliet April 25th, 1843 Mr. Isaac MARKS in the 86th year of his age.

Page 2:2 - DEATH OF A REVOLUTIONARY OFFICER - The last of the Aides-de-camp - The Hon. Hodijsah BAYLIES died at Dighton, Mass. on the 26th ult in the 87th year of his age. Judge BAYLIES was educated at Harvard College, on leaving which in 1777 he joined the American Army, as aide to Gen. LINCOLN; and he served through the war during the latter part of which he was one of the aides of Washington, being recommended by his friend Gen. LINCOLN when the latter became Secretary at War. Probably no officer of the Revolution survives, who like Judge BAYLIES, was present at the surrender of the hostile forces both at Saratoga & Yorktown. For many years he was Judge of Probate of the County of Bristol being appointed in 1810 and resigning on the approach of his 80th year. He had been Collector of the U.S. Customs from the
