While in England he became by the choice of William PICKNEY & Christopher GORE, the 5th Commissioner under the Jay Treaty, for the settlement of the American claims upon England; and holding as he did the determining vote in all contested cases, he was so fortunate as to acquire the entire & honorable impartiality & justice of his decisions.

In his personal character and intercourse Col. TRUMBULL had all the polish and amenity of a high bred gentleman with all the forbearance and consideration for others which go far to make up his character. He has died at a ripe old age and left not an enemy behind.
