Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In West Troy on 26th ult by Elder O. DODGE, Mr. Arsenal WEBBER of Cazenovia to Mrs. Patience RICHARDSON of this place.

JULY 17, 1844

Page 2:2 - On the 6th inst., William LEE was found drowned inside - cut Lock #1 at West Troy. An inquest was held on the body and it appeared from the evidence that he had treated some of his friends on the previous evening at Lovett's Grocery, a few yards from the Lock, and after drinking set and slept for some time - got up about 11 o'clock and went out -- but did not return as his friends expected. They went to the door, it being very dark and windy and called for him but he gave no answer and they thought he had gone to his lodging. It is said that he was a man of very intemperate habits and it is supposed that he in that half unconscious state blundered into the Lock and was drowned and the Jury gave a verdict accordingly. Said LEE was an Englishman, a journeyman shoemaker about 40 years of age, and it did not appear that he had a family or relatives in this vicinity.

- On the 11th William CUNNINGHAM was found drown at the old junction in the old Lock No. 3. It appeared that on the evening of the 5th, he and one of friends went to Atchison's Grocery on the edge of the lock and asked for whiskey, which on account of a crowd of people in the house, was not got for them. His friend went out immediately but CUNNINGHAM stopped for some time and went out alone after 9 o'clock and he was not seen again until found in the lock on Sunday. As he spent part of his time at Cohoes and part with his friends in the Junction, he was not missed or searched for. Verdict of the Jury accidental drowning. Mr. C. is represented as a man of very amiable disposition without an enemy and with one solitary but overshadowing vice.
