Page 2:5 - William JENKINS a news vendor of 468 Third & Broadway was found dead in Bell & Browns Shipyard.

Sylvester WEEKS died in the City Prison of wounds received previous to being placed there.

Eliza WINTERS, colored, burnt and suffocated in a burning dwelling

Henry SCHWARDING, sailor on the Brig Breman North River (These four deaths were in New York City Coroner's report)

OCT OBER 23, 1844

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Albany on the 15th inst by the Rev. D. Wyckof, the Rev. J. McP. MYER, Paster of the R.P.D. Church of Cohoes to Miss Alida, daughter of Isaac P.F. LANSING Esq of the same place.

3:1 - DIED - In this Village on the 19th inst Emily, daughter of George & Emma LEARNED, age 2 yrs & 3 mos.

OCTOBER 30, 1844

Page 2:5 - In Coneant Township, CrawfordCounty (Pa), on the 5th inst Mr. KELSEY who had been absent from home since the preceding day was found in the woods with his throat cut he was not dead to the 18th inst but there was no hope of his recovery. A report was set afloat that he was induced to committhe rash act by the infidelity of his wife; which report reaching her ears, she declared her innocence to the attending physician and the next morning was found a lifeless corpse having destroyed herself by poison.

Jean Louis BARBARIN, a native of Marsailles France, who served in the American Army during the Revolution and was also with General JACKSON at New Orleans, died in the latter City on the 11th inst in the 90th year of his age.
