Page 2:4 - OLD AGE - Mr. John HIGHTOWER, A Soldier of the Revolution died a week or two since in Marengo County, Alabama at the age of 126 years. He received a wound at Braddock's defeat, 99 years ago.

Page 2:5 - Death of Mrs. N. F. WILLIS - Mrs. WILLIS died after a few days illness at the Aster House, New York on Tuesday Evening March 25th at half past ten o'clock. She was the daughter of Mr. STACE, the Governor of the Royal Arsenal at Woolwich England.

Page 2:5 - DEATH OF THE OLDEST MAN IN VERMONT - On the 21st ult, Benjamin BUSHE died at Greensboro at the extraordinary age of 115 years. He was a native of old Swanzew, Mass. and formerly resided in this town. We have no account of any person in Vermont attaining beyond 106 years of age (Vermont Watchman)
