1 NE—Serpent Mound State Memorial

The largest serpent effigy mound in the world, stretching 1,330 ft. in length overlooking the East Fork of Ohio Brush Creek. Mound was constructed by prehistoric Fort Ancient people about A.D. 1070. Park is owned and maintained by The Ohio Historical Society. A small museum/gift shop has exhibits on the Serpent Mound and the Serpent Mound CryptoeXplosion Structure. Hiking trails are located in and around the park grounds. 3850 SR 73, parking fees, hours may vary seasonally. Call for times 937-587-2796 or 800-752-2757; www.ohiohistory.org/places/serpent

23 NW—Harshaville Covered Bridge is the last covered bridge still used in Adams County. Erected circa 1855 and used by Confederate General John H. Morgan and his raiders when they passed through the county in July 1863. Located on Graces Run Rd. in Harshaville.

43 SW—Moore's Memorial Chapel is the site of the first Methodist Church erected in the Northwest Territory by Joseph Moore in 1800. The pulpit was constructed by Rev. A. D. Singer from 16 kinds of native wood. The building is surrounded by a burying ground for pioneers. Located 1/4 mile up Wintergreen Rd. in Blue Creek.

50 SW—Adams County Genealogical & Historical Society is housed at the Heritage Center in an original Associated Reform Presbyterian Church building—an extensive library for genealogical and historical research, as well as a museum, located just off SR 247 about 1-1/2 blocks from the Courthouse on Heritage Way. Log cabin on site. Open Thur. & Sat. 12-4; 937-386-2309.

62 SW—Counterfeit House Museum was built in 1850 by Oliver E. Tompkins for the purpose of counterfeiting 50 cent and \$500 bills. It has trick locks, trap doors, secret rooms and compartments. Legend has the owner would signal riverboat men by putting a special colored light in the window. 1580 Gift Ridge Rd.; Open weekends 10-6; 937-549-2309.

65 SW—Gov. Thomas Kirker Home, Grave and Bicentennial Barn The hewn stone section of the house is the original home of Ohio's second governor. Erected in 1805, it consisted of four rooms, two on the ground level and two upstairs. The stone mason was Thomas Metcalf, later a governor of Kentucky. SR 136 & Zane's Trace Road; The home is not open to the public. Adams County's Bicentennial Barn is located on the farm and can easily be seen from SR 136. Grave is open to the public and is located in the Kirker cemetery across the street.

73 SW—Kirker Covered Bridge

Located off SR 136, the bridge is the second to last covered bridge to be used in the State highway system. No longer in use, but still standing. Parking available.

76 SW—Manchester Historical Society

Displays 200 year history of Manchester Village and Township. Hours: Saturday 12-4; 307 Pike St.; 937-549-3888.

92 SW—West Union Presbyterian Church

Built of hewn stone in 1810, stone mason Thomas Metcalf later became Governor of Kentucky. Gov. Thomas Kirker was instrumental in getting the church built. Dyer Burgess, abolitionist, was an early minister. The structure is on the National Register of Historical Places. It is the oldest church structure still in use in Ohio. 104 S. 2nd St. 937-544-2066.

95 SW—William Lafferty Memorial Funeral & Carriage Collection and Lee-Armstrong Cemetery

Located beside the Lafferty Funeral Home features an antique hearse, horse-drawn vehicles and memorabilia dating from 1848. 205 S. Cherry St.; Hours: Saturday 10-2 or by chance/ appointment; 937-544-2121. The cemetery located behind contains 14-20 graves most within an iron fence.

2 NE—Scenic-View Cottage

4 NE—Davis Memorial State Nature Preserve is the most diverse state nature preserve in this region. Over 18 species of rare plants, unique geological features such as karst and faulting, and excellent spring wildflower displays. 167 acres with excellent hiking trails, best visited: April, May, Sept., Oct. On Davis Memorial Rd.; 937-544-9750.

10 NE—Brush Creek State Forest is part of this 12,000 acre forest located at the eastern edge of Adams County. Hiking, horseback riding trails and picnic areas available. Paved access on Churn Creek Rd. and Lower Twin Creek Rd.; for information: 275 SR 73, Peebles, OH, 45660.

34 NW—Tranquility Wildlife Area is 3,500 acres for public hunting, fishing, and hiking. Located northwest of Tranquility between SR 770 & 32; 513-987-2508.

45 SE—Shawnee State Forest encompasses multi-County facilities offering hiking, fishing, riding trails, hunting, lake, and lodge, 4404 SR 125; 740-858-6621; www.shawneelodgesort.com.

54 SW—Adams Lake Prairie State Nature Preserve is an excellent example of the County's many prairie openings which provide habitat for rare prairie vegetation. Best visited: July, August, April, May. Located within Adams Lake State Park; 14633 SR 41, 1 mile north of West Union; 937-544-9750.

55 SW—Adams Lake State Park

Fishing, boating (electric motors only), picnicking, blacktop walking path, shelter house available, playground and restrooms available. 14633 SR 41; shawnee.parks@dnr.state.oh.us

61 SW—Chapparral Prairie State Nature Preserve

is comprised of 66 acres nearly one-third Blackjack-Post Oak prairie opening and home to Ohio's largest populations of Rattlesnake Master, Pink milkwort & Prairie false indigo. Best visited: April, May, July, August. 209 Hawk Hill Rd.; 937-544-9750.

71 SW—Johnson Ridge State Nature Preserve

Much of this 208 acre preserve is wooded, including one of the State's largest protected populations of Prairie false indigo, a threatened species. Best visited: April, May, June. No trails or improved parking available. Unity and Marjorie Johnson Rd.; 937-544-9750.

77 SW—Manchester Islands

Located in the Ohio River. In earlier times there were three islands, but only two remain. Legend has it that the Indians would disguise themselves as white men and ambush settlers who were traveling the Ohio River. Currently a National Wildlife Refuge under the supervision of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service—open to public daylight hours; www.fws.gov

93 SW—Whipple State Nature Preserve

248 acres near the Ohio River; one of the best to view early spring wildflowers. Ridges are pocketed with sink holes while the valley is rimmed with cliffs and dotted with large slump blocks of dolomites. Best visited: April, May, October. 2 mile trail and very limited parking; approximately one mile north of US 52 on SR 247; 937-544-9750.

Edge of Appalachia Areas

41 SE—Edge of Appalachia Preserve & Office is owned and managed by Cincinnati Museum Center and The Nature Conservancy. 3223 Waggoner Riffe Rd.; 937-544-2880 or 544-2188.

38 SE—Wilderness Trail at the Edge of Appalachia Preserve circles a beautiful wooded hollow. It is filled with spring wildflowers and great fall colors. Views of cliffs and rocks in any season, hilly 3.5 mile hiking trail loop, follow the yellow blazes. Located at the parking area end of Shirener Rd. just N of Lynx; 937-544-2880 or 544-2188.

40 SE—Buzzard Roost Rock Preserve at Edge of Appalachia Preserve is named for the turkey vultures or "buzzards" that soar overhead. Scenic vistas abound from this rock overlook in the hills high above Ohio Brush Creek; hilly 3.5 mile trail to the top, gravel parking at the eastern end of Weaver Rd. off SR 125; 937-544-2880 or 544-2188.

42 SE—Lynx Prairie Preserve at Edge of Appalachia Preserve was established to save some of the finest examples of prairie once prevalent in the Lynx area. 250 species of plants found typical of prairies and grasslands west of the Mississippi. Peak bloom in August, 1.5 mile fairly level hiking trail, entrance behind East Liberty Church Cemetery off Tailip Rd.; 937-544-2880 or 544-2188.

7 NE—Mineral Springs Lake Resort

This recreational and camp complex combines a 100 acre lake with 500 acres of forested hills & ravines, 27 ft. lake depth, 5.5 miles of varying shoreline.
