Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 43,454 for 20 acres, issued in favor of Thomas Taylor, Corporal, Captain Brown's Company, Ohio Militia. War of 1812.

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the East half of the North East fractional quarter of Section two, in Township one, South, of Range one, East, in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Defiance, Ohio, containing seventy nine Acres, and Sixty four hundredths of an Acre.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: Which has been assigned unto Dighton Taylor

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said Dighton Taylor

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Dighton Taylor, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Franklin Pierce, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
