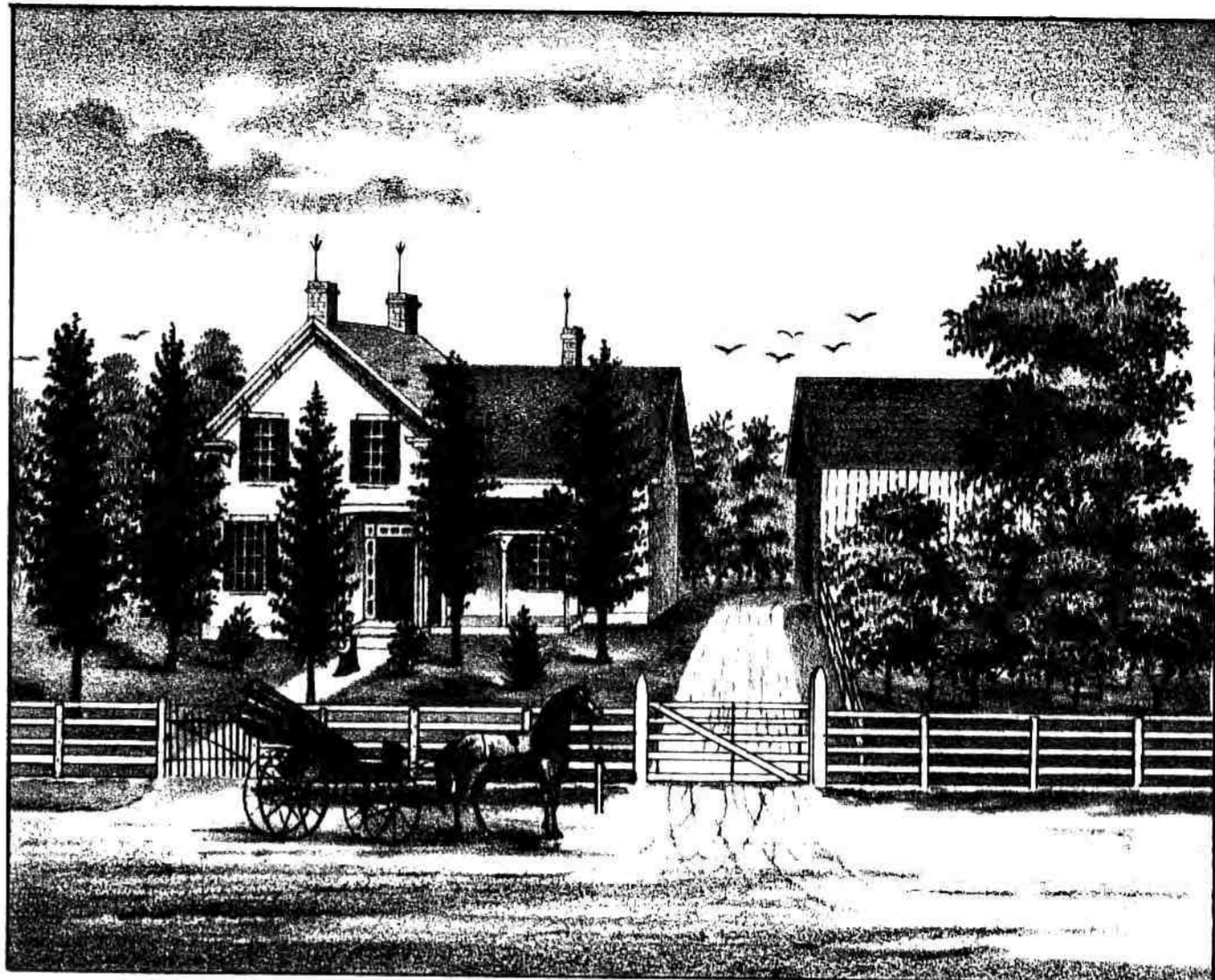
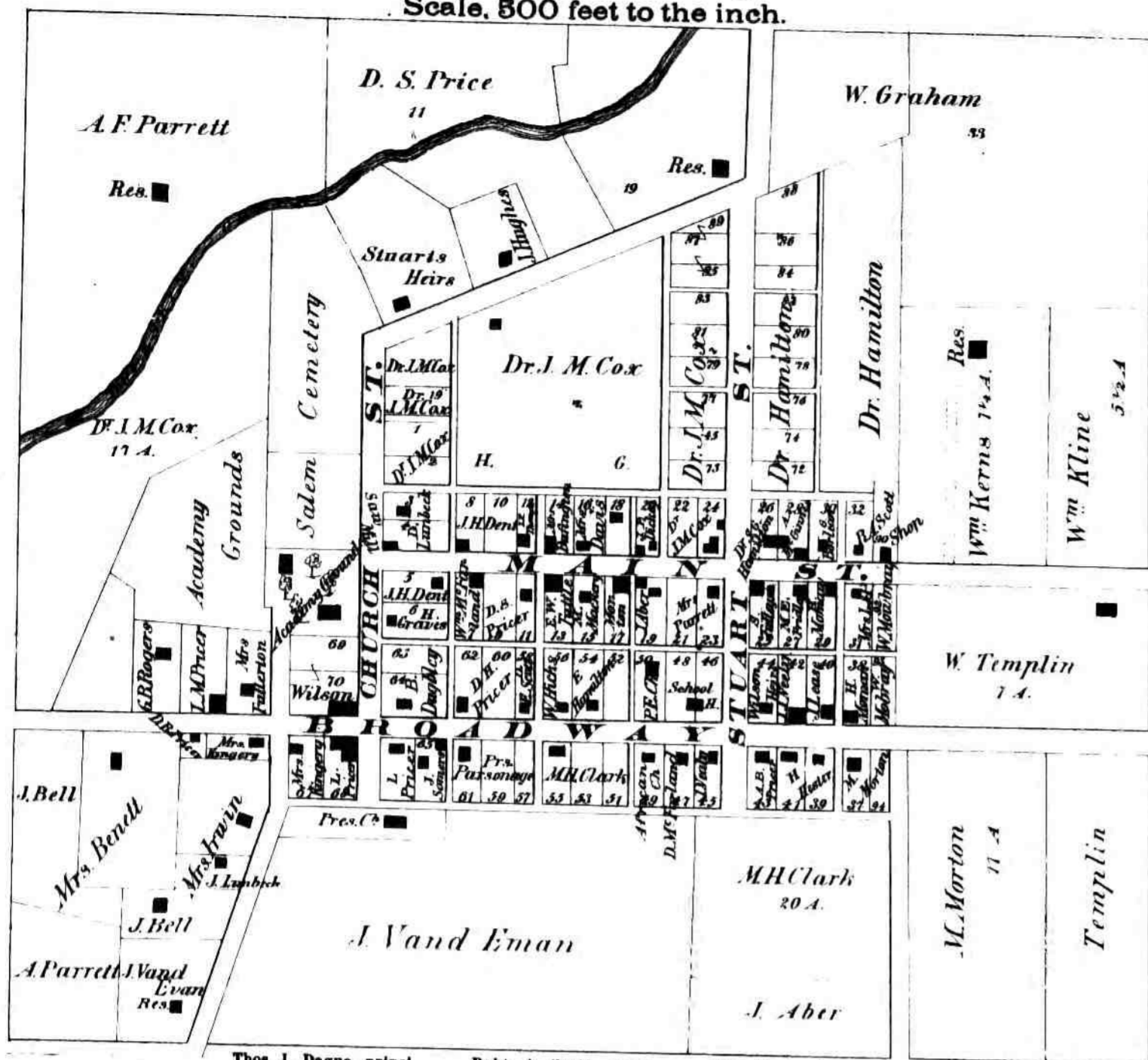


SOUTH SALEM.

Scale, 500 feet to the inch.



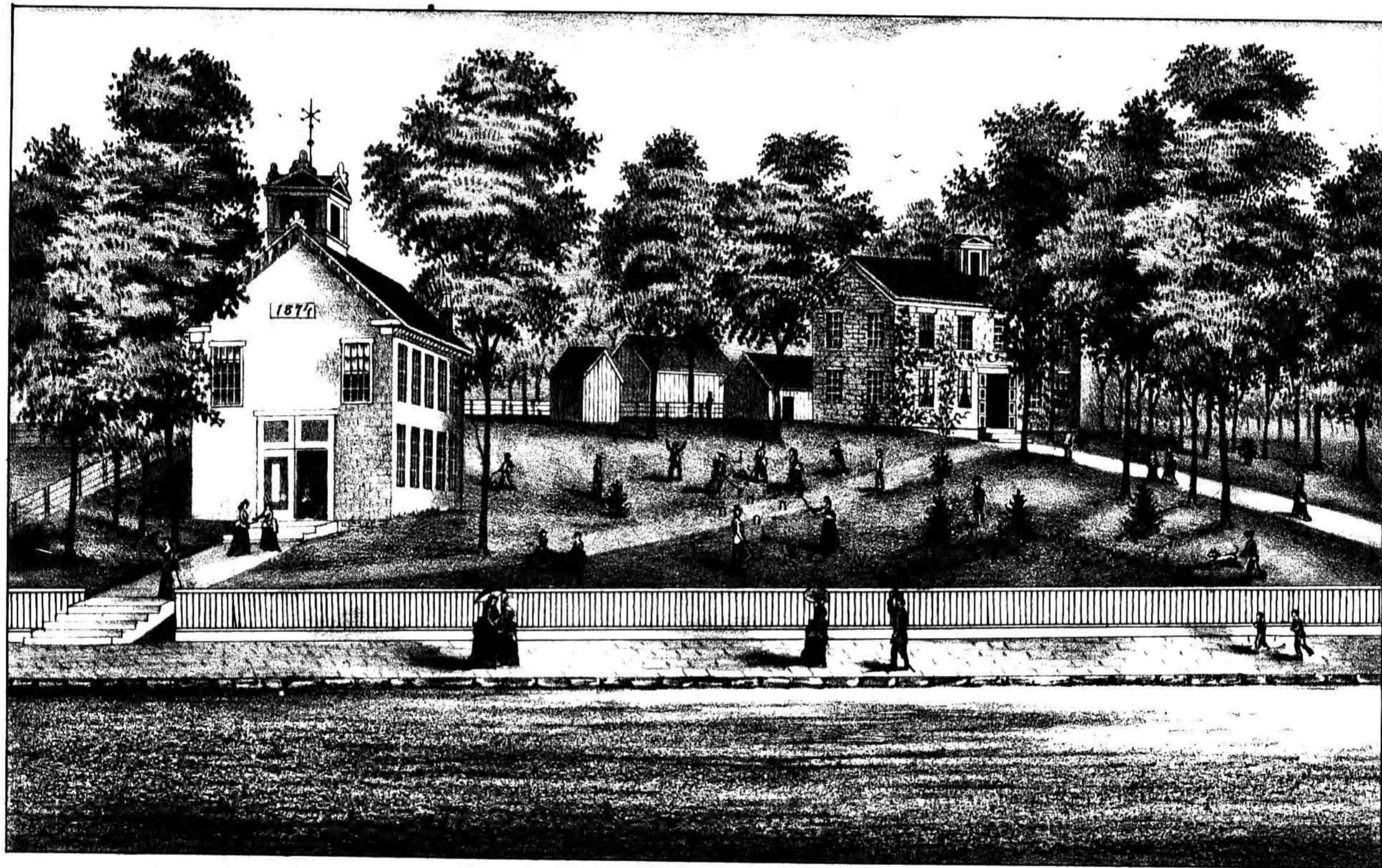
