Little Manila: Filipinos in California's Heartland

This month, the SJCGS is pleased to welcome as our speaker Anita Bautista, Vice President of the Stockton Chapter of the Filipino American National Historical Society. In Ms. Bautista's multi-media presentation, she will include information on Filipino heritage and family history in San Joaquin County, providing examples of recorded biographies in paper and album form.

The Stockton Chapter of the Filipino American National Historical Society includes, among its projects, the provision of assistance to members and groups wishing to record Filipino American oral history or "Talk Story." The chapter's project goals include an archival collection, including historic photographs and videography.

As Vice President of the Stockton Chapter of this organization, Anita Bautista will speak to the current efforts of her organization in preserving local Filipino history, including the projects and long term goals listed on [their website](#).

We invite you to join with fellow members of the SJCGS in welcoming Anita Bautista to our May membership meeting. As we did last month, we will begin gathering at 5:45 p.m. on Thursday, May 23, so that the presentation may begin promptly at 6:00.

The key to making this afternoon session a success is the volunteer contributions of our members. Without their help, this program would not be as successful as it is.



Dear SJCGS Member,

Our society is having an eventful spring, with excellent activities coming up for you to enjoy.

Just recently we had a charming and engaging speaker, Elizabeth Lew, at our April 18 membership meeting, giving us stories about her grandparents and earlier ancestors who came to the Bay area from China and suffered discrimination, such as the Exclusion Acts. Elizabeth told us about the ancestral history of 5000 years she was able to trace back and what she had learned on her several trips to her ancestral village there.

A field trip tour of the Cambodian Buddhist Temple on April 27 was another chance to learn about the customs of other Asian-American citizens, many of whom live here in the San Joaquin Valley.

Coming up this month is the **Saturday, May 18**, beginner's genealogy workshop at the Margaret Troke Library in north Stockton. The morning presentations will be a continuation of previous sessions on military records and immigration and naturalization records. In the afternoon **we need SJCGS volunteers** to help participants with starting their research (mainly on the computers at the library).

Our **Thursday, May 23**, membership meeting at Troke Library will welcome our speaker, Anita Bautista of the Filipino American Historical Society, speaking on local Filipino family history. Please join us.




First Lady of Micke Grove Regional Park: Mrs. Julia Harrison Micke


Julia Harrison (later known as Mrs. William Micke) came from a well established pioneer family of Stockton. Her grandfather, Joseph F. Harrison of Iowa, arrived in San Joaquin County by September 9, 1850, and settled in Linden, California. He raised stock and did teaming and farming. He was a member of the San Joaquin Society of Pioneers:

Julia Harrison's father, William Bruce Harrison (1849-1905), was a teacher, clerk, bookkeeper, president and manager of Farmers' Union and Milling Company, School Director, Councilman-at-large, and Mayor of Stockton. Her mother was Belle E. Griffiths (1854-1943).




Julia Harrison's father, William Bruce Harrison

When Julia's father William Bruce Harrison died in 1905 at his home in Stockton (buried at Stockton Rural Cemetery), his wife Belle, daughter Julia (soon-to-be Mrs. William Micke) and a son were all living at the family home located at 444 West Poplar Street in Stockton, California.

Julia Harrison was a clerk at a savings bank before she married Mr. Micke in 1909. Mr. Micke was thirty four years old; Julia Harrison was thirty one years old. The marriage was held at William Micke's house in Lodi. Julia was a dainty bride; William was six feet tall.


Though Julia and William Micke had no children, their dining room table had four people sitting around it for many years. The two additional people were Julia's mother, Belle Harrison Shaw, and Julia's stepfather, James Shaw. They lived with Julia and William Micke from at least 1920 until they both passed away (James Shaw in 1934; Belle Harrison Shaw in 1943. Belle is buried next to her first husband at Stockton Rural Cemetery).

Mrs. Micke enjoyed her mother's company for many years while they lived together at the Mickes' house. This mother and daughter team attended various functions together such as the Order of Eastern Star in Stockton, Hartford Women's Relief Corp. of Lodi and Ladies Auxiliary to California Pioneers at Haggin Museum in Stockton. In the 1930s, they probably even rode to and from their meetings in Mr. Micke's Franklin automobile. You can see his car in the Tree and Vine Building at San Joaquin County Historical Museum located within Micke Grove Regional Park (known to all as simply Micke Grove Park).

Julia and her mother also enjoyed being active members with various organizations. Every May, for example, this mother and daughter team would host a picnic at Micke's Grove for the Ladies Auxiliary to California Pioneers.

Julia was also a life member of Lodi Woman's Club and a member of Saint John's Episcopal Guild of Lodi.

An exhibit of Julia and William Micke's living room can be seen in the Erickson Building at San Joaquin County Historical Society and Museum. The Mickes' house furnishings were simple—even though Mr. Micke passed away in 1961 as a millionaire from growing grapes and fruit trees.



In 1952, Mrs. Julia Harrison Micke passed away with a sudden heart attack while visiting the Lodi Grape Festival with her husband, William Micke.

William Micke spent his remaining years eating at Hollywood Café, which is still in existence on Cherokee Lane in Lodi. It is located across from the Orchard Hardware store where Julia and William Micke had their home and packing shed.


Mr. Micke passed away in 1961.

Their house was demolished in 1967.

Julia and William Micke are entombed at the mausoleum located at Lodi Memorial Park and Cemetery at 5750 East Pine Street in Lodi, California.

Memorials of Julia and William Micke can be seen throughout Micke Grove Park. Three of them were built by William Micke in memory of his wife: a swimming pool in 1953 (which is

no longer in existence), a memorial building and auditorium in 1955, and a zoo in 1957.

In conclusion, William and Julia Micke believed that children should have a place where they could play. One can visualize William and Julia Micke sitting at their dining room table, dreaming and planning their oak grove becoming a recreational park for families and all to enjoy.

Wouldn't it be nice if they could see their oak grove today—simply known to all as Micke Grove Park.
