## Tracing One Woman's History

*The Story of a Widow's arrival in California in 1871*

**Thursday, November 15**

**7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.**

*California in the 1870s was probably not the most hospitable place for a widow's arrival from out of state. Yet, after her first husband's passing, Martha Young-Laird chose that exact future for herself.*

At our upcoming meeting, **Alaina Young** of the Lockeford Historical Society and Harmony Grove Cemetery will present the story of Martha Young-Laird, one of Alaina's California pioneer family's ancestors. Drawing from thirty years' experience in genealogy research and the stories of the pioneer family she married into, our speaker this month will detail the results of her pursuit of Martha Young-Laird's history, within its context of the early pioneers in the Lockeford area.

Our meeting this month is hosted at Casa Bonita mausoleum—the building located on Cemetery Lane just outside the entrance to the Stockton Rural cemetery. The location is at the northern end of Cemetery Lane, and can also be accessed via California Street by turning east on Pine Street and continuing until it ends at Cemetery Lane.

The building provides ample, well-lit parking toward the back of the building, where you can also access the building through the parking lot entrance. (Those who have been involved with the ongoing transcription project on Wednesdays will already be familiar with this location.)


