for some ten or twelve years before the Cherokee  
Indians <sup>moving</sup> West that he knew the reservation  
of land of six hundred and forty acres  
which was allowed to said Drewy Jones  
Cherokee upon which land the deponent  
frequently been and had become well  
acquainted with the same that said  
land is situated convenient to Tennessee  
River on the ~~west~~ <sup>mouth</sup> of the same  
a Naragava ~~Indian~~ and said land  
is well worth two dollars per acre  
and that said land lay about three  
miles below the mouth of Rabbit and  
about one mile below James Jones  
Reservation and that Drewy Jones was  
a son of Elizabeth Jones a Cherokee Indian  
and said land lay in Marion County  
Tennessee about three miles below the  
mouth of ~~Pratt~~ <sup>Pratt</sup> and

said Drewy Jones is entitled to all  
the rights and privileges of a Cherokee  
Citizen
