

ATTACK BY THE FRENCH AND INDIANS

The French and Indians, emboldened by their victory over Grant, made an attack in the 14th of October, on the advance guard of the army at Loyal Hanna. The attacking party consisted of twelve hundred French and two hundred Indians, and the attack continued for four hours, and afterwards renewed at night. But the assailants gained no advantage, and retired to Fort Duquesne. The returns of the army show a loss in this engagement of twelve killed, seventeen wounded, and thirty-one prisoners.
