

BLACK LICK.

Dr. Thomas McMullen, a native of Centre Township, Indiana county, was educated at the Academies of the county; studied medicine with his brother Jas. McMullen – graduated at Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia – located at Black Lick, in 1853, and practiced his profession there till the fall of 1854, when he moved to Mechanicsburg, and in 1856, moved to Monmouth, Illinois; remained there near a year, and returned to Mechanicsburg, and remained there till 1858, then moved to Greenville, where he practices his profession. He represented Indiana county in the legislature, during the years 1872 and 1873.

Dr. T. P. Simpson, came from Beaver county to Black Lick, for manufacturing purposes, about 1870. After spending a few years at the place, the community pressed him at times, into the practice of medicine. After serving them a few years, he moved to East Liberty, Allegheny county, Pennsylvania.

Dr. Samuel Wiggins, was raised in the vicinity of Shelocta, and was educated at Elderton Academy. He studied medicine with Dr. T. L. Marlin, and graduated at the Jefferson Medical College, Philadelphia. He practiced his profession about two years at Livermore, Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania, and in 1875, located at Black Lick, where he resided at present.
